ATR-1 – One helmet, endless missions

Sometimes, innovation starts with a simple question. At Busch PROtective, we asked ourselves: **Do traditional helmets still meet the demands of today's missions?**

That question drove us to create a solution that truly reflects the realities faced by modern first responders – that go far beyond conventional firefighting. What used to be the standard is now the exception. Modern firefighters and rescue teams face a wide range of challenges: technical rescue, wildfires, water rescue, high-angle operations, and Urban Search and Rescue.

These missions demand a helmet that is more **versatile, scalable and multi-certified – while remaining lightweight, ergonomic, and sustainable.**

With **the ATR-1**, we've achieved exactly that: we created a true multi-purpose helmet – not a compromise, but a thoughtfully designed platform. Built on our years of experience with modular helmet systems and informed by anthropometric data, the ATR-1 meets numerous standards:

- EN 16471:2014 – Wildland and forest firefighting
- EN 16473:2014 – Technical rescue
- EN 12492:2012-04 – Mountaineering helmets
- ISO 16073:2011 – PPE for wildfire fighting
- ISO 18639-5:2018 – PPE for technical rescue
- EN 1385:2012 – Canoe & water sports
- PAS 028 – Marine safety helmets
- UIAA 106
- KWF Comfort seal

The ATR-1 is the result of our vision:

A modular helmet platform that adapts to the mission – not the other way around.

Designed for action. Made for people. Three shell sizes (**48–66 cm**) ensure optimal ergonomics, which is crucial for long and demanding operations. Weighing under **750 g** (size H3) with a sleek profile, the ATR-1 stays comfortable and easy to carry while offering top-level protection – even in temperatures down to **–40 °C**

Our tool-free assembly rail makes the helmet ready for action in seconds. Visors attach in a flash with **the Speed-Connect System (SCS) – no tools, no helmet removal required.** Modular eye and hearing protection, as well as communication systems, can be added as needed.

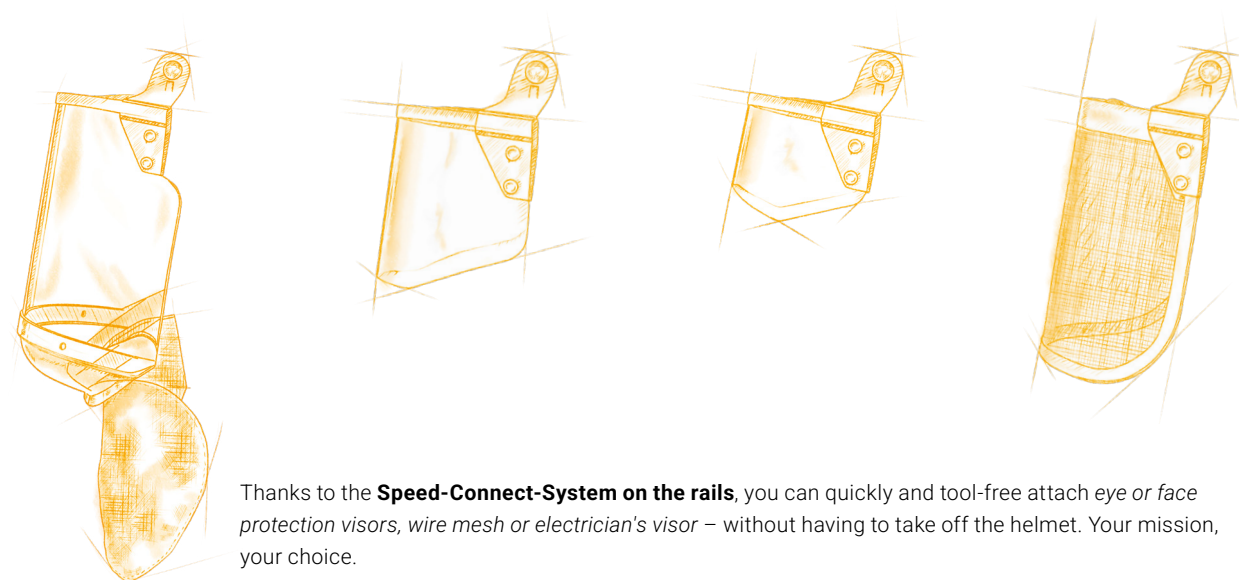
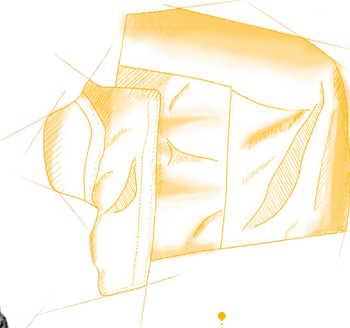
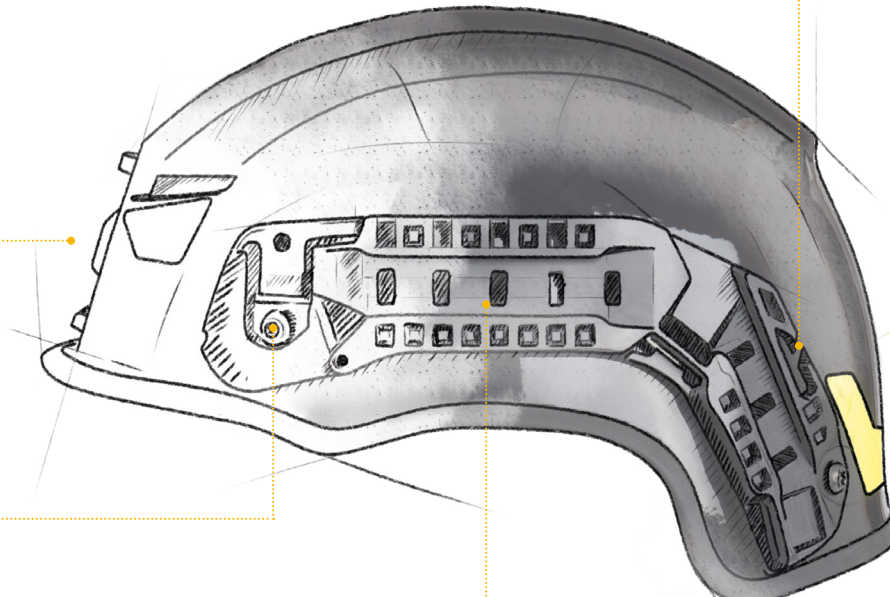
The ATR-1 helmet is a platform with a system of accessories. This allows you to configure the ATR-1 for all hazardous situations – tool-free and in no time.



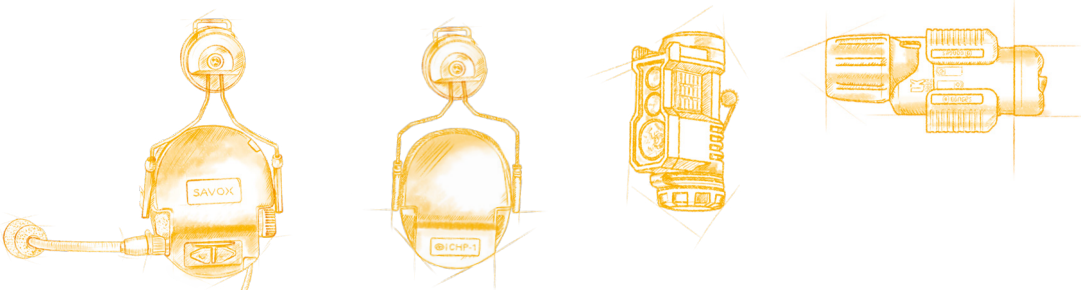
The Universal Headlamp Mount (USH) allows the installation of *headlamps, cameras, identification plates* and much more.



If you prefer to protect your eyes with *goggle* instead of a visor, we have two options that you can also mount **on the rail**.



Thanks to the **Speed-Connect-System on the rails**, you can quickly and tool-free attach *eye or face protection visors, wire mesh or electrician's visor* – without having to take off the helmet. Your mission, your choice.



Even when a visor is mounted, **the rail** remains free for additional accessories. Decide for yourself whether you need *hearing protection, a communication headset or a light* during your mission. Simply snap it into place.

With **G-hooks**, additional accessories can be attached to the helmet, such as *the wildland shroud or the neck guard*.

CERTIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS

Everything you always wanted to know – but never dared to ask.

Spontaneous decisions are great – on vacation, for example. In emergency operations, nothing can be left to chance. Personal protective equipment plays a critical role in safety – and sometimes in life or death situations.

On the following pages, we provide a compact overview of the most important standards and certifications for operational helmets used by fire services, emergency medical services, disaster response, and civil protection. We provide you with the knowledge you need to assess which standards, tests, and certifications that relevant for your organization.

In terms of your vacation? Just see what happens!

GOOD TO KNOW

In Europe, the standardization of personal protective equipment (PPE) is regulated by PPE Regulation (EU) 2016/425 and the corresponding European standards (EN standards), which are mandatory since April 21, 2018. These standards define the health and safety requirements for PPE. Compliance is demonstrated through the CE marking.

PPE Regulation (EU) 2016/425:

This regulation defines the requirements for design, manufacture, and placing on the market of PPE and replaces the former PPE Directive.

CE Marking:

Products that meet the requirements of this regulation must carry the CE mark in order to be placed on the market within the European Union.



EN 16471:2014 – Firefighting helmets for wildland firefighting

Helmets certified to EN 16471 are designed for wildland and vegetation firefighting. The standard focuses on outdoor operations where heat, flames, and impact are the primary hazards. This is different from EN 443, which applies to helmets used in structural firefighting.

Key requirements include:

- Protection against heat
- Protection against flames
- Impact protection
- Comfort factors such as weight, balance, and ventilation

The ATR-1 meets all EN 16471 requirements. It protects against flames, sparks, and mechanical impact. Despite its low weight, it delivers a high level of performance. Balanced weight distribution and effective ventilation allow the helmet to be worn comfortably for extended periods.

In short: the ATR-1 provides certified protection combined with lasting comfort – allowing you to stay focused on the task at hand.

GOOD TO KNOW

ISO vs. EN – What’s the difference?

ISO standards are international and apply worldwide. EN standards are European standards and form the basis for CE marking. For users, this means: EN certification is required for use in Europe. ISO certification shows that a product also meets international standards.

EN standards have a regional scope and often reflect a European adoption of an international standard. When an ISO standard is adopted in the EU, it becomes an EN ISO standard.

ISO 16073:2011* – Helmets for Wildland firefighting

This standard defines requirements for helmets specifically designed for wildland and vegetation firefighting. These operations take place in environments where sparks, flying particles, radiant heat, and dropping vegetation are constant hazards. The goal is to provide protection without causing heat buildup or additional physical strain.

Typical tests include:

- Protection against radiant heat and sparks
- Temperature resistance up to approx. 180 °C without deformation or melting
- Impact and penetration resistance
- Visibility through reflective elements
- Comfort during extended operational periods, supported by lightweight design and good ventilation

The ATR-1 is certified according to ISO 16073:2011. This means it provides reliable protection during wildland fires while remaining low in weight, comfortable, and secure – even during long operational periods.

In short: the ATR-1 provides proven protection in wildland environments. ISO 16073:2011 stands for tested safety without compromising comfort or visibility.

EN 16473:2014 – Firefighting helmets for technical rescue

EN 16473 defines the requirements for helmets used in technical rescue operations. The main focus is protection against electrical, mechanical, and chemical hazards. Thermal protection is also required.

Key requirements include:

- Shock absorption
- Penetration resistance
- Protection against electrical hazards
- Chemical resistance
- Comfort factors such as weight, fit, and ventilation

The ATR-1 is tested and certified according to EN 16473. It provides reliable protection in demanding operational scenarios – from traffic accidents to search and rescue operations and technical assistance. Thanks to its low weight and well-designed ventilation, it remains comfortable even during long deployments.

In short: the ATR-1 provides safety for a wide range of rescue operations, combined with a high level of wearing comfort – allowing responders to focus fully on their task.



ISO 18639-5:2018* – helmets for special rescue operations

This standard defines minimum requirements for helmets used in special rescue operations, such as traffic accidents or search and rescue (USAR) missions following earthquakes. These operations involve risks such as dropping debris, impact loads, or limited chemical exposure. This standard assesses helmet design, material quality, and how it was tested.

Firefighting operations and other high-risk scenarios, such as chemical or biological hazards, are intentionally excluded.

The ATR-1 meets the requirements of ISO 18639-5 and is thus ideal for technical rescue operations involving traffic incidents or entry into collapsed structures. It is light, robust, and designed to remain comfortable during long and demanding operations—without compromising protection or certification standards.

In short: ISO 18639-5 serves as proof of quality for helmets used in technical and urban rescue, where mission-appropriate protection, reliably tested materials, and comfort are equally important. The ATR-1 demonstrates its versatility here.

EN 12492:2012-04 – Helmets for mountain rescue and work at heights

EN 12492 defines safety requirements and test methods for mountaineering helmets. Certified helmets protect against hazards which can occur during climbing activities. Whether in mountain rescue or work at heights, every second counts. Protective equipment must perform reliably in the event of falls, falling objects, or mechanical impact.

Helmets certified according to EN 12492:2012-04 provide:

- Protection against mechanical impact
- Ventilation
- Reduced risk of the helmet being ripped off during a fall

The ATR-1 helmet is thoughtfully designed and offers good ventilation as well as high wearing comfort through-

In short: EN 12492 is essential for high-angle rescue and rope rescue operations.

Worldwide, only 1.32% of all operations involve interior structural firefighting.

or rescue deployments.

UIAA 106 – Additional safety for operations in extreme conditions

The UIAA safety label is a clear indicator of maximum protection. A UIAA safety label on a product means that samples of the equipment have been tested by an accredited, independent third party and have been shown to meet the requirements defined by the UIAA standard. UIAA safety standards are regularly reviewed and updated by the UIAA Safety Commission. This ensures that they continue to reflect changing market conditions as well as the evolving demands of climbing and mountaineering.

The UIAA 106 standard for helmets builds on the proven requirements of EN 12492 and adds an additional level of safety:

- Energy absorption test (vertical impact)
- Higher requirement: UIAA ≤ 8 kN | EN ≤ 10 kN
- Energy absorption test (frontal, lateral, and rear impact)
- Higher requirement: UIAA ≤ 8 kN | EN ≤ 10 kN
- Penetration test
- The tip of the cone must not contact the headform.
- Chin strap strength test
- 500 N; the chin strap may not stretch more than 25 mm.
- Retention test (frontal and rear)

In short: helmets carrying the UIAA safety label are well suited for rescue operations that demand the highest level of PPE safety.

EN 1385:2012 – Helmets for canoeing and whitewater sports

EN 1385:2012 defines requirements for helmets used in whitewater scenarios. Originally developed for canoeing, the standard is now also widely applied in water rescue. It ensures that helmets provide reliable protection in extreme water conditions and remain securely fastened on the head.

Tests include, among others:

- Impact absorption: protection against hard impacts in water or against obstacles
- Fit and stability: the helmet must not shift or come off in currents or during submersion
- Retention (chin strap): the fastening system must hold securely without stretching or tearing
- Field of vision and comfort: clear visibility and comfortable wear over extended operational periods

For water rescue responders, this means: EN 1385 helmets provide certified protection in currents, during impact, or when submerged. They stay securely in place when every second counts.

In short: EN 1385 ensures reliable protection for water rescue missions, allowing rescuers to fully focus on the people in need.

EN 14458:2018 – High-performance visors for protective helmets

EN 14458:2018 defines requirements for visors that must only be used in combination with protective helmets (such as EN 443, EN 16471, EN 16473, EN 14052). The standard distinguishes between different visor types and designs, ensuring that visor solutions are precisely matched to operational needs.

In technical rescue and wildland firefighting, the right visor provides the required eye and face protection.

Under EN 14458, the following visor types are certified:

- Eye visor when lightweight, focused protection is sufficient
- Face visor with heat protection when exposure to sparks or heat is expected
- Mesh visor when mechanical hazards are the primary concern

In short: EN 14458 ensures that you get the right visor for the job – matched to the situation, safe, and compatible with your helmet.

EN 166:2001 becomes EN ISO 16321:2022 – personal eye protection in transition

For decades, EN 166:2001 was the European standard for safety eyewear and face protection. Since its introduction in 2001, it provided reliable protection against mechanical impact, radiation, and chemical hazards based on standardized test methods and markings.

Transition to the new standard: EN ISO 16321

Since May 2022, EN 166 has been replaced by the international standard series EN ISO 16321, which will become the sole valid standard for new certifications as of November 11, 2025.

Validity of existing certificates: Products certified under EN 166 remain valid until their official expiration date, but no longer than five years. For example, eyewear certified by October 31, 2024 may continue to be sold until October 31, 2029. There is no sell-through deadline for existing stock.

**What's new in EN ISO 16321-1:2022?
The new standard introduces significant updates, including:**

- Higher standard protection with new tests such as heat resistance over 120 minutes (double the duration compared to EN 166)
- High-speed impact tests in three levels (C, D, E) with defined protection zones (OPZ, EOZ, FPZ)
- Penetration test at visor gaps: maximum opening of 1.5 mm permitted
- Numerous new optional tests, including protection against radiation, liquid splash, molten metals, chemical resistance, anti-fog performance, high temperatures, explosive atmospheres, and more
- New marking system indicating protection against UV (U), IR (R), glare (G), welding (W), high-speed impact (C, D, E), etc.

In short: EN 166 set the standard for many years. EN ISO 16321 adapted to the future – offering higher protection levels, more detailed requirements, and improved suitability for international operations.

Of all firefighting operations, only 33.6% involve interior structural firefighting.

EN 352-3:2021 – Making hearing protection part of the helmet

In technical rescue operations, construction environments, or when operating loud equipment, hearing protection must function reliably while being fully compatible with the helmet system worn by the user.

EN 352-3 – certified earmuffs provide:

- Proven noise attenuation, even when combined with a helmet
- Compatibility with different helmet models, either fully tested (base model) or validated through a supplementary assessment
- Durability and comfort, due to robust materials, comfortable ear cushions, and secure mounting
- Clear user information, including head size range, care instructions, and helmet compatibility

In short: EN 352-3 ensures that hearing protection and the helmet function as a single system – safe, comfortable, and flexible in use.



KWF Comfort Seal – proven quality for operational equipment

The KWF seal identifies products tested by the Kuratorium für Waldarbeit und Forsttechnik e. V. (KWF). The testing of the organization is independent, practice-oriented, and focused on safety, ergonomics, and quality.

What does the seal stand for?

- The Institution: For decades, KWF has evaluated equipment and protective gear for forestry and rescue operations, using objective, user-focused criteria.
- ATR-1 with KWF Comfort Seal: The ATR-1 has been awarded the KWF Comfort Seal. Testing focused on wearing comfort, fit, and ergonomics. The result: the

helmet provides high comfort and unrestricted movement, even during long deployments.

- Test methods: A combination of laboratory tests and field evaluations, ranging from technical performance measurements to real-world operational assessments.

Why does this matter?

A KWF seal confirms quality beyond basic standard requirements. Products bearing the KWF Comfort Seal offer high wearing comfort and reliable performance—safety you can feel.

In short: The ATR-1 carries the KWF Comfort Seal – a clear mark of verified quality and noticeable wearing comfort in the field.

The ATR-1 is a multipurpose helmet designed for technical rescue, search and rescue operations (USAR), wildland and vegetation firefighting, rope rescue, water and whitewater rescue, and emergency medical services. It sets new standards in personal protective equipment.

The helmet was developed based on differentiated hazard analyses and specific operational requirements. This resulted in a versatile helmet suitable for a wide range of applications. Thanks to its modular design, the protective capability of the ATR-1 can be expanded individually and adapted to the respective operational scenarios.

Key features of the helmet:

- Increased protection against penetration and improved impact absorption
- Three helmet shell sizes for optimal adaptation to different head sizes
- Side rails and an integrated front mount for attaching various accessories
- Accessories 100% applicable to the helmet, EU norm-tested and approved
- Easy adaptation to different operational scenarios thanks to the modular design
- High wearing comfort through special padding that adapts to the wearer, a 4-point chin and neck strap, and a dial adjustment system
- Thermally resistant helmet shell for high durability under heat exposure
- Interior components specifically designed for long-duration operations
- Low weight for fatigue-reduced work

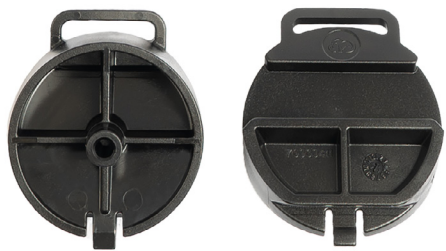

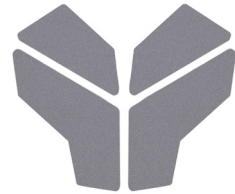

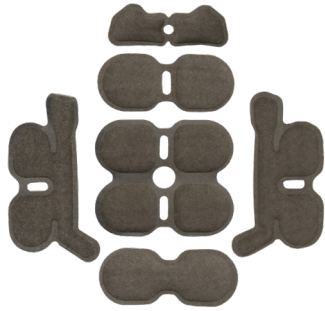
